FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

The Importance of Doing Something

Spring, 2024

Travel to Israel has always been a priority in my work as your rabbi. Upon arrival in 2011, I began working relationships with Jewish National Fund, the Masorti Movement and the Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest. I have sought genuine relationships to nurture in between congregational trips, and have made a point of connecting with our friends and associates every time we go there.

None of these things stopped on October 7, 2023 on that terrible day of slaughter at the hands of Hamas. We lost friends, and the world is disrupted by war. The communities near the border with Gaza that did not come under direct attack still have lost their workers, and their men and women have been drafted into the army. They struggle to re-establish schools, and to maintain farms without labor with the sad truth that irrigation helps weeds as much as crops and their fields are overrun months later.

Jewish National Fund was able to organize emergency volunteer missions to the south and back in October - even before I had anyone committed to come with me - I promised our congregation would come. It was never in doubt.

From January 20-25 we went with a single goal: Just tell us what to do. What do you do in the face of nearly infinite needs? The Mishnah teaches **וּבְמָקוֹם שֶׁאֵין אָנָשִׁים, הַשְׂתַּדֵּל** : **לֵהוֹיֹת אִישׁ** : In a place where there are no people, try to be a person. There was no one to weed this crop, or clean this path. They are killed, captured, at war or relocated elsewhere. There are not enough people to do the daily work to save the vegetables for market, to prepare the schools for children or to support the soldiers on leave.

Pick up a shovel, a rake, a paint brush or a wheelbarrow. Get to work. We farmed one day, and weeded another. We stood in the now horrific beauty of the Nova festival and planted trees in memory for the future. We stood at graves of entire families and wept the memorial prayers. We went to the hospital where the free hostages were first treated - the same hospital that had hundreds of terror victims arrive minute after minute on those horrible first days. We did nothing extraordinary. We were a group of people trying to help our people in their time of need.

On the bus we sang songs, held serious conversations, and got to know and love each other as members of Bnai Shalom in a way that only happens when we travel together. New friends, and old come home closer to each other and Israel as a result.

We are not alone. They are not alone. In another age, the cossacks, the crusades, the nazis murdered and plundered at will and no one was there to stop them. Today we have Israel, and we will defend our people. Those of us who can not go to war, can go to farm, sweep or support. We can never forget, that we are people.

I hope that you will join me on March 6th for the JNF Breakfast for Israel ([Breakfast for Israel in Central New Jersey ,Wed, Mar 6th, 2024 @ 7:30 AM, Jewish National Fund-USA \(jnf.org\)](https://www.jnf.org/breakfast-for-israel)), that you will find an opportunity to travel to volunteer, that you will donate generously and that you will continue to stay engaged during our people's time of need.

ANNOUNCING THE SYLVIA AND BUDDY EDELMAN CHAPEL AND LIBRARY

With profound gratitude to our members Barry and Bobbi Ostrowsky, B'nai Shalom is honored to announce plans for the complete renovation of our daily *minyan* chapel to become the **Sylvia and Buddy Edelman Chapel and Library**. Construction is already underway.

The **Edelman Library** will be rebuilt within the chapel, providing a learning and program space for our religious school, Culture and Learning Center, congregational films, book talks and more. This *beit midrash* area asserts that our path to God is found as much in Torah study as in prayer, and both are sacred.

The new chapel includes the installation of six 9 foot tall mosaic panels, depicting scenes and themes of Jewish life and observance, donated by the B'nai Jacob community of Jersey City as their building was closed. Created by Dr. Abe B. Glatt, father of our member Elaine Ben Shalom, they shape the room in stunning light.



A newly designed ark and reading table, together with chandelier, lighting, molding, carpeting and more, complete the prayer space for our daily *minyan*. Surrounded by memory and legacy, we will support each other for *kaddish* and celebrations here for years to come.

The two outside panels on the extreme left and right are based on the twelve tribes fathered by Jacob which is the name of the *shul* (B'nai Jacob) where they were originally installed. The other four panels depict the three main functions of a *shul*: ingathering, prayer and study.

Preparing your home for Pesach

All preparation of the house and foods must be done well before Yom Tov. In order to prepare for Pesach, each room of the house must be carefully cleaned. We recommend a number of tips and suggestions.

1. Check all sofa and chair cushions and vacuum carefully.
2. Use a vacuum cleaner with attachments to clean all the baseboards and corners of rooms.
3. Clean out toy boxes, and wash all toys on which baby may have spilled formula or juice, or with which a child may have played at meal time.
4. Check between mattresses; one never knows what could be lurking there.
5. Pocketbooks, pant cuffs, coat pockets and jeans pockets (especially those of little children) should be carefully searched.
6. Be especially careful during the cleaning of your den/TV room; you will be amazed at the places that *chametz* can be hiding.
7. Remember, automobiles also must be thoroughly cleaned inside and out and all chametz removed.

The Kitchen – Ready, Set Scrub

The Kitchen will require your most serious attention. If you follow our guide, you should find the process much easier.

The Refrigerator: Empty the refrigerator. Clean the interior thoroughly using a new (and, therefore, Pesachdik) sponge. Remove all the racks, bins and shelves to facilitate cleaning. When done, cover the plastic racks and bins and metal shelves. Restock the refrigerator with only Kosher -for Passover foods.

Toaster Ovens: Cannot be koshered for Passover.

Blenders and Mixers: *Buy separate units for Pesach.* Kashering them is so difficult, practically speaking it is impossible.

Dishwasher: See page 6 of "Passover Guide"

Counters and Table-tops: See page 7 of "Passover Guide"

Kitchen Sinks: See page 4 of "Passover Guide"

Drawers and Cabinets: These must be cleaned. Any cabinets and drawers that will not be used should be sealed with a bit of tape, (or, better still-put a "closed for Yom Tov" sign on it) to avoid any accidental use of items that remain inside.

Gas and Electric Ranges: See pages 5-6 of "Passover Guide"

Bread Drawers: Clean the bread drawer and **close it for Pesach.**

The following blessings are recited over the holiday candles:

Baruch Ata Adonai, Elohaynu Melech Haolam, Asher Kiddashanu Bemitzvotav Vetzivani, Lehadlik Ner Shel (Shabbat v'Shel) Yom Tov. (Add words in parentheses if yontef coincides with Friday Night.)

ברוך אתה ה' אלהינו מלך העולם אשר קדשנו

במצותיו וצונו להדליק נר של (שבת ושל) יום טוב.

You are be blessed Adonai, our God, King of the Universe, who sanctified us by His commandments and has commanded us to kindle the (Shabbat and) Yom Tov Candles.

"Shehecheyanu" is recited only on first night of the holiday after candles have been lit:

Baruch Ata Adonai, Elohaynu Melech Haolam, Shehechayanu, Vekiyemanu Vehigiyanu Lazman Hazeh.

ברוך אתה ה', אלהינו מלך העולם שהחיינו

וקיימנו והגיענו לזמן הזה.

You are blessed Adonai, our God, King of the Universe, who has kept us alive and sustained us and brought us to this season.

The Omer and Weddings Our Rabbi's Ruling

The period between Passover and Shavuot is called Sefirah, which means "counting," a name derived from the practice of counting the Omer, beginning from the night of the second Seder of Passover, and continuing until the eve of Shavuot. Traditionally this period has been a time of sadness. According to Talmudic legend, 12,000 of Rabbi Akiva's students died one year during this period from a plague. Historians connect this event with the Hadrianic persecutions which followed the Bar Kochba rebellion against Rome, in which Rabbi Akiva was intimately involved. For these reasons the custom developed of allowing no weddings or festive celebrations during the Omer, with the exception of events taking place on Lag B'Omer and Rosh Chodesh.

The Committee on Jewish Law and Standards of the Rabbinical Assembly has ruled that because the reasons for declaring this period to be one of mourning are so unclear and on such shaky historical ground, the prohibition against "some" simchas in the period may be waived. However, with the institution of Nisan 27 (always five days after the last day of Passover) as "Yom Hashoah," "Holocaust Remembrance Day," we allow no simchas until after this date. Please consult with Rabbi Tobin before planning festivities during the Omer.

COUNTING THE OMER

COUNTING THE OMER is the name given to the process of counting the days between Pesach and Shavuot. Each night, beginning with the second night of Pesach, we recite the appropriate Bracha and count the days until we have counted 49 complete days, at the conclusion of which Shavuot is celebrated.

IMPORTANT PESACH TERMS

HAGGADAH תַּגְּדָה means "telling a story." The seder (meaning "order" of service) is based upon the Biblical command: And you shall tell your son on that day saying "It is because of that which the Lord did for me that I came forth out of Egypt." In reading The Haggadah, we observe the biblical command to tell the story of Exodus from Egypt. The Haggadah is filled with the idea of God as man's redeemer and hope in times of crisis, from ancient Egypt until our own day.

KIDDUSH is the sanctification of the day over wine. In many cultures, wine was served for orgies and קִדּוּשׁ ritual toasts to the gods. In Judaism, the cups of wine announce the special holiness of a Festival, Shabbat, or special Simcha (such as a wedding or Brit Milah). We announce the Kiddush that we are about to partake in a service to God and in the celebration of a sacred time on the calendar.

ROASTED SHANKBONE (ZAROA) זְרוּעַ, symbolizes the Passover sacrifice offered in the ancient Temple in Jerusalem, thousands of years ago. It was always eaten with the entire family together, as a large clan, a tradition which we continue today by our family seders.

ROASTED EGG (BEITZAH) בֵּיצָה represents the festival offering brought to the temple on all holidays (called in Hebrew a Korban Chagigah). It supplemented the Pesach sacrifice during this holiday. It also symbolizes life eternal, and may be seen as a symbol of mourning as well for the Temple in ancient times and the Six Million today.

MAROR מָרוֹר the bitter herbs (Romaine Lettuce or Horseradish) symbolizes the bitter plight of our ancestors in Egypt.

CHAROSET חֲרוֹסֶת the mixture of apples, nuts, wine and cinnamon also is a symbol of slavery. It reminds us of the color of the bricks and mortar used in slavery. The pleasant taste reminds us of God's kindness which relived our bitter slavery.

KARPAS כַּרְפָּס consisting of lettuce, onion, parsley, potatoes, or stalks of celery (each family has its own tradition) recalls the springtime. We dip karpas into salt water as an opening to questions

B'DIKAT CHAMETZ בְּדִיקַת חָמֵץ The search for Chametz which takes place the evening before the 1st seder, after sunset.

M'CHIRAT CHAMETZ מְכִירַת חָמֵץ The selling of the Chametz which is arranged through the Rabbi, to a non-Jew. It usually includes utensils, stored foods, etc. which cannot be discarded for Passover.

BITUL CHAMETZ בִּטּוּל חָמֵץ the nullification of Chametz – the pronouncement found in the Haggadah recited after the search and the burning of Chametz.

BI'UR CHAMETZ בְּעוֹר חֵמֶץ the burning and disposal of Chametz before the end of the last quarter of the day preceding the 1st seder.

SH'TAR HAR'SHA'AH שְׂטָר הַרְשָׂאָה The authorization signed by each person empowering the Rabbi to act on their behalf to sell his/her chametz before Pesach begins.

PROCEDURE FOR THE SALE OF CHAMETZ

In addition to the thorough cleaning of the house before Pesach (as well as the car, school lockers and office desks), we are commanded to completely free ourselves from all traces of Chametz. We, therefore, follow these procedures:

1. Each Jewish home must be cleaned and made Pesachdik (proper for the Holiday) no later than the morning before Passover. Please see enclosed times for burning Chametz.
2. Chametz products that will be kept for use after the holiday should be stored away in a separate area (a closet, cabinet, corner of garage, etc.).
3. Chametz utensils (pots, pans, etc.) should be stored and cabinets sealed. The ownership of these is "transferred" for the holiday period.
4. Businesses, in which Chametz is sold during the year, must "transfer" (sell Chametz) ownership for the holiday period in the same fashion as the home. (For specific cases, contact the Rabbi.)
5. Feeding your pets Chametz is of benefit to you, and we are not supposed to benefit from Chametz. You may wish to include the pet in your "sale."

AFTER THESE PRODUCTS ARE STORED AWAY, THE TITLE TO THEM SHOULD BE TRANSFERRED TO RABBI TOBIN. He will contractually arrange for them to be sold to a non-Jew for the duration of the Pesach holiday. Hence, even the Chametz which we have stored in our homes technically does not belong to us (and therefore cannot be used or consumed by us), thereby totally freeing us from all Chametz in our possession.

IT IS NOT ENOUGH TO STORE THESE ITEMS. THE RABBI SHOULD BE EMPOWERED TO SELL THEM ON YOUR BEHALF.

After the immediate conclusion of Pesach, everything in your storage areas will be repurchased by the Rabbi from the non-Jew for your subsequent use **after 9:00 PM on Tuesday, April 30th.**

HOW CAN I SELL MY CHAMETZ? The most preferable way is to sell the chametz (not the food itself: merely the legal title to it) to the Rabbi. There will be secure black drop off boxes outside the main entrance and outside the reception window.

The Memorial Scrolls Trust is pleased to announce a scroll gathering in New York City to celebrate MST's 60th anniversary on **Sunday afternoon April 7, 2024, at Temple Emanu-El of New York**. The planning committee has been hard at work to create an afternoon that will be an everlasting memory for all participants. MST Scrolls from New York, New Jersey, Connecticut and other states are being invited for a reunion of the scroll survivors. The last time we held a gathering here in 2019, we had 75 scrolls and 800 people. We hope that your organization will join in. Whether you bring your scroll or not (we hope you do), please invite your constituents. It will be a remarkable event.

This group of 1,564 scrolls which were collected by the Jewish Community in Prague during the Nazi occupation represents the vibrant cultural and religious life of Czech Jewry that once existed. These sacred objects survived when 85% of Czech Jews were murdered in the Shoah. After being collected, stored, moved and eventually sent to London, these scrolls are the tangible links from past generations to today. Help us honor the Jews killed in the Holocaust and celebrate the continuity of Jewish life today.

***Pariahs Among Ayatollahs:
The Jew as Outcast in Shiite Iran***
Guest Speaker: Ken Blady

Tuesday, April 30th, following services in the Gruhin Sanctuary

Iranian Jewry is the oldest documented community in the world, having resided in Persia continuously for almost three thousand years. Yet in no other country in the Diaspora have the Jews suffered from so many centuries of unrelenting oppression and mortifying legal restrictions. At the instigation of cruel despots and the extremely hostile and fanatical *mujahaddin* (Shiite clergy), thousands of Jews were slaughtered, while those who managed to survive existed in conditions of the most brutal penury and dehumanization. On numerous occasions Jewish communities escaped annihilation only by embracing Islam. At one time possibly numbering in the millions, the entire Jewish population of Persia was several times brought almost to the brink of extinction.

In this informal presentation we will survey the story of the Jews of Persia from Queen Esther to the rise of the Ayatollahs. A segment of the lecture will be devoted to the fascinating community of Djedid al-Islam (Islamic crypto-Jews) of the holy Shiite city of Mashhad.



Educator, writer, and Yiddish translator, Ken Blady, was born in Paris, France, and grew up in Chassidic Brooklyn, where he attended yeshiva and rabbinical seminary. A San Francisco Bay Area resident since 1972, Ken has a B.A. in History from UC Berkeley, an M.A. in Clinical Counseling from CS University, East Bay, and doctoral work in Integral Counseling at the California Institute of Integral Studies. He is the author of "Jewish Communities in Exotic Places," and author, editor, and translator of ten published works. As a popular lecturer on Jewish history and Yiddish language themes, Ken has been featured on radio and T.V. talk shows and has been a professor at a variety of adult educational institutions.



GREETINGS FROM SISTERHOOD

Hope Springs Eternal

I am so happy to be sitting down on a very snowy February day to write this column about Sisterhood Spring events! Just thinking about Spring makes me hopeful about the future and life, despite extraordinary times and challenges in our world today. We were fortunate to have some outstanding and inspiring programs last month, from celebrating the 100th birthday of the Jewish Federation of MetroWest with a delicious Kiddush, to our Rina Kurland Book Club program for Jewish Disability month. It was heart-warming to see such a large gathering in the Main Sanctuary to discuss Being Heumann, about the life of disability rights activist Judy Heumann. So many of us were very inspired by Judy's life, the tremendous barriers she overcame and how her lifetime fight for disability rights changed the lives of millions of people, and the power and influence she attained in both the White House and around the world.

As we kick off the month of March, we must recognize International Women's Day on March 8th, celebrated around the world and, in some countries, it is even a public holiday! Gloria Steinem, world-renowned feminist, journalist, and activist, explained, "The story of women's struggle for equality belongs to no single feminist, nor to any one organization, but to the collective efforts of all who care about human rights." Gloria spoke to Judy on her podcast, Heumann Perspective, just weeks before Judy's passing in March 2023. Since I wrote this same quote in last year's Hayenu, I have a much deeper understanding of it as I have since found out how involved Gloria has been in the fight not only for women's rights, but for other marginalized groups, including the disability community.

Speaking of women who have had an undeniable impact, at the end of this month we will be celebrating Purim and telling the story of Queen Esther, our Jewish heroine! Queen Esther uses her unique position and displays tremendous courage in risking her life to stop Haman from his plot to

exterminate the Jewish people in Persia in the fifth century BCE. This year the celebration of Purim, with eerie familiarity, reminds us of the horrendous and brutal attacks on October 7th and yet another attempt to eliminate the Jewish people. As we rattle our groggers to blot out the name of Haman, let us also remember the power one person can have to change the course of history.

We have many great programs coming up this Spring! On Sunday, March 17th, we have a special in-person event with author Michelle Cameron, to discuss her latest novel Babylon: A Novel of Jewish Captivity,





JEWISH MEMORIAL CHAPEL

Providing Service to the Jewish Community

B'nai Shalom is one of 23 organizations that support the Jewish Memorial Chapel in Clifton. The Chapel's mission is to provide affordable Jewish funerals for the local community. Every Jew, regardless of their family's financial situation, will receive a traditional Jewish funeral.

The Chapel is one of only a handful of nonprofit Jewish funeral homes in the United States. Its Officers and Board of Directors are made up of delegates from the Chapel's members which consist of synagogues and other Jewish organizations in the area.

Funerals are arranged and conducted by professional licensed funeral directors. The Chapel's funerals are conducted with dignity and in strict compliance with *Halacha* (Jewish Law).

The Chapel has a stand-alone **Kohanim Chapel**, complete with a bi-directional audio/video hookup to the main chapel. The Chapel is located less than two miles from King Solomon and Menorah

A number of B'nai Shalom's members have used the services of the Jewish Memorial Chapel in Clifton.

One family was enthusiastic about the cost savings at the Chapel. They checked prices at several area funeral homes.

The cost for the same funeral at the Jewish Memorial Chapel was about half of what it would have been at a for-profit funeral home.

The Chapel's funeral directors will provide you with good advice about pre-planning. Pre-planning a funeral allows families to make decisions without the emotional stress related to the loss.

The **Jewish Memorial Chapel** was formally incorporated in 1921 as the **Passaic United Hebrew Burial Association**. Its origin actually dates back to 1907. In 1999, helped by a bequest from the late William and Ida Gurtman, it constructed a beautiful, state-of-the-art facility at **841 Allwood Road in Clifton**, just off Route 3.

At the end of the fiscal year, any excess Chapel earnings over expenses are returned back to the community. The money that is disbursed is earmarked for education, health, or care of the



elderly. Since joining the Jewish Memorial Chapel in 2012, B'nai Shalom has received \$23,600. This money was used for programming, supplies and equipment for our Religious School and library.
